Great music from Lightsey, Tiptons, more

Detroit-born pianist Kirk Lightsey is elegant, and so is Goodbye Mr. Evans (Evidence). Joining the dancingly dextrous Mr. Lightsey in this stunning series of striking jazz standards are the fabulous Famoudou Don Moye on drums and the Euro-bassist Tibor Elekes. A beautifully flowing medley of Eddie Harris' Freedom Jazz Dance, Wayne Shorter's Pinocchio, Temptation and Giant Steps is the main attraction, with Moye's powerful punches battling it out with the leader's split-second timing throughout its course, but the remainder of the pieces (Brubeck, Jimmy Heath, Monk, a Lightsey original and Phil Woods' title tune) are equally enthralling. They even turn Elekes' adaptation of Chopin themes into a prime-time mainstream outing. Playing so solid, you'll be embarrassed not to own it.
